Usually the American Color Print Society rents the Plastic Club for its annual show in November. 98th Members' Medal Show

The 98th Annual Members' Medal show opened on May 2nd on a warm Sunday afternoon. The reception was well attended and as usual, provided the guests with food for the stomach as well as for the eyes. Seventy-two of our members showed on hundred and thirty works in all media. This is the largest turnout in recent times. Artist and teacher Karen Saler was the juror. She awarded the Plastic Club Gold Medal to Karl Richard Olsen for his haunting portrait drawing entitled "Norge" (The model for the drawing was of Norwegian descent). The Silver Medal was awarded to John Benigno for his evocative photograph of an old adobe church in New Mexico entitled "San Francisco de Asis." The Dorothy Invernizzi Guinn Memorial Prize for realist art was won by Bob Bohne for his stilllife, "Crustacean Feast." This is the second time that Bob has won this award. The Zeigler Award went to Ellen DiPiazza for her lovely watercolor, "Morning Sky." Jon Baccile, Abraham Davidson, Burton Greenspan, and Peter Cottingham received Honorable Mentions.
