ACPS Exhibits Prints

The American Color Print Society had its 70th Members' Exhibition at the Club in November. 72 prints in various techniques were shown. This is always a beautiful show because of the care that these artists give to their work and the attention they pay to their framing and presentation. The juror, Tricia Fagen, Director/Curator of the Gallery of Mercer County Community College, awarded 14 different endowed prizes. There was also an exhibit of works by Lois Johnson in the Board Room.

Red, White, and Green Show

Appropriately enough, this theme show opened in December. With the traditional holiday decorations already in place around the Club, the art work with its red, white and green color, added to the holiday spirit. Even the food at the reception followed the theme with red tomato pie pizza and green and red soda, and a cherry punch. 44 members of the Plastic Club took part in this members only show. The juror, Richard Hamilton, awarded First Prize to Peter Petraglia for his pen and ink drawing entitled "Tubulars." Second Prize went to Dorothy Roschen for her relief tile piece that was totally on target...three squares; one red, one white, and one green. The Third Prize went to Peter Cottingham for his pastel of a nude model. Honorable mentions went to Morris Klein, Karen Frank, Lois Schlacter, and Patricia Wilson-Schmid.

New Members' Show

Twenty-four artists who have joined the Plastic Club since January, 2009 exhibited their work at the annual New Members' show. It opened on Sunday, January 10th, with a reception that was extra-ordinarily well attended. 77 works in all mediums were on the walls making it one of the largest New Members shows in recent times. It is gratifying to see that we are continuing to attract new members who are gifted artists. From abstract to realistic work, in large and small scale formats, the show was a great testament to the strength and diversity of our membership.

"Small Worlds" Show

Despite one cancellation and the threat of another, the "Small Worlds" show opened on Sunday, February 14th. But, nothing except the work is small. This is the largest show we've had at the Club in anyone's memory. 199 works were submitted by 119 artists, a record in both categories. The winning work, chosen by the juror, Gail Bracegirdle, is an oil painting by Sibylie Pfaffenbichler entitled "Sailors On Leave." Second Prize went to Sissy Pizzollo for her Mixed Media piece entitled "Book Dolls III 'Nana' Gone Not Forgotten." Third Prize was awarded to Diane Podolsky for her print, "Island Life." Honorable mentions were won by David Lightner, Nick Brown, Paul Clement, and Doris Peltzman.
