The **Small Worlds Show** is anything but small. This year we exhibited 246 works of art that were 16" or less in any dimension. The winners this year were: First Prize: **Don McPartland** for his mixed media piece entitled "Kicker Conspiracy". Second Prize went to **Jocelynn Tice** for her pastel called "Buds". Third Prize went to **Karen Saler** for her mixed media work, "Venetian Hinge." Honorable Mentions went to **Helene Halstuch, Dave Janetta, Robert Bohne, and Mary Logue**. The juror was **Murray Dessner**, who is a teacher at PAFA.

In April, **Tom Torosian** rented the Club for a personal show of his work that he named "Art is Happening.... Again." *You too* can rent the Club. It's only \$500 for the month. Of course, you have to get on the schedule a year or so in advance. Talk to Alan if you're interested.

In May we held the **99th Annual Members' Medal Show**. We're talking *real* gold and silver medals. It's our most prestigious show and we always have a good turnout. This year the Gold Medal was won by **Lois Schlachter** for her painting, "Party Time." The Silver Medal was won by **Bonnie Schorske** for her photograph, "9 Parrots in an Acacia Tree." The Dorothy Invernizzi Guinn Memorial Award was won by **Alden Cole**. A new award this year, the Mildred Beizer Prize for Still Life, was won by **Debora Weber**. The Zeigler Prize was won by **Theresa Lee**. And three Honorable mentions went to **Leroy Forney, Marie Shafron, and Peter Cottingham**. The juror was **Andrew Werth**.

We would like to thank **Karen Frank** for establishing the Beizer Prize in honor of her friend and former Plastic club member, Mildred Beizer.

The annual **Workshop Show** opened with a party on Saturday night, June 4th. 81 paintings, prints, drawings, and watercolors were on exhibit. **Nick Brown** even brought in some of his pottery illustrated with figures of the life models. Outside in the garden, lit with little lights and candles, Bob fired up the grill and cooked hot dogs. Potato salad, sauerkraut, chili, fruit salad, and all the condiments, plus wine, soda and beer, rounded out the evening's offerings. The "best in show" will be determined by popular vote. The winner gets four free workshops.

October 2-30 Photographic Society of Philadelphia Members' Show This is a rental.


November 7-27 American Color Print Society Members' Show So is this.
