## **Jessie Willcox Smith and Friends**

On Sunday afternoon, March 12th, **James C. Thompson** came to the Plastic Club and gave a lecture about late 19<sup>th</sup> / early 20<sup>th</sup> century illustration and the involvement of some of the Plastic Club's founding members, particularly Jessie Willcox Smith. Mr. Thompson is the author of "*Painting America's Portrait, How Illustrators Created Their Art*". To supplement his lecture he brought with him four original Jessie Willcox Smith paintings generously lent by the Illustrated Gallery of Fort Washington, PA. Much of the lecture centered on the improvement of the means to reproduce illustrations in books and other media in the late 19<sup>th</sup> / early 20<sup>th</sup> century. These improvements gave illustrators the ability to use color and continuous tone in their works rather than just black line. Many of our founding members were professional illustrators, There is a copy of the book now in our library.
